Simon Smart Foundational

Simon is Executive Director of the Centre for Public Christianity. A former English and history teacher, Simon has a Masters in Christian Studies from Regent College, Canada. He has years of experience in writing and editing, both academic curricula and popular books. He is the author of For God's Sake: An Atheist, a Jew, a Christian and a Muslim Debate Religion, and editor of A Spectator's Guide to Worldviews. Simon is co-host of the documentary For the Love of God: How the Church is Better and Worse Than You Ever Imagined.

Simon lives on Sydney's Northern Beachers. He is a sports tragic and an enthusiastic but inept surfer. He has two teenaged children who still don't mind being seen with him in public!

It's a girl! Is the Christian gospel good news for women?

Abstract: Early Christianity was mocked as a religion of women and slaves – that is to say, not to be taken seriously. But Christianity is much more likely to be condemned today, not for being a religion for women, but a religion against women. If gender equality mattered to the early church, what happened to it? What does Christianity's chequered treatment of women mean for its credibility today? And is the Christian faith a force for the oppression of women, or for their flourishing?

In this session Simon will consider Biblical, historical and cultural material in order to try to make sense of the sometimes troubled relationship between women and the Christian Faith.

Justine is Senior Research Fellow at the Centre for Public Christianity where she speaks and writes about the Christian faith in a secular age, with a particular interest in freedom and individualism, and trends in contemporary culture. She has a doctorate in Cultural Studies from Macquarie University and a Bachelor of Arts in Communications (Journalism) from UTS. After getting her start in the Sydney Reuters bureau, she worked as a presenter at Fairfax Digital. Justine is co-host of the documentary For the Love of God: How the Church is Better and Worse Than You Ever Imagined.

Abstract: In a world that encourages us to be the author of our own stories, collecting experiences as part of the great 'project of self', we discuss what it means to take up our role in the greatest story ever told: the cosmic drama of God's redemption. We then consider how this can inspire us to live countercultural lives—particularly in areas like sex and relationships, power, purpose and freedom.



Richard Shumack Topical

Richard is a Christian philosopher specialising in belief. He is interested in how and why people believe what they do – especially about God. He has lived and worked among Muslim communities in Australia and overseas.

Richard is a research fellow at the Centre for Public Christianity and the Director of Melbourne School of Theology's Islamic Studies programme. He speaks on Christian engagement with Islam at schools, universities and seminaries.

Richard lives in Sydney with his wife, Judy, and their four boys. He loves eating curry, playing and coaching AFL football, and loves and hates golf.

What is true Islam, and who is my Muslim neighbour?

Abstract: Islam is no longer a distant, foreign faith in Australia. All of us have Muslim friends, classmates and sporting teammates. But what do they believe? The media sends us very mixed messages about this, being full of stories about Muslim terrorism on one hand, and Islamophobia on the other. Some say that Islam is inherently violent; others that it is peaceful. Which is true? This session explains the basic beliefs of Muslims and why you shouldn't be scared of your Muslim neighbour, and why it is super-easy to talk to Muslim friends about Jesus.

If you are a principal, teacher, chaplain, youth leader or parent, Bible Society is asking you to invite students who would benefit from a day to invest in their spiritual development. Masterclass will better prepare them to be public Christians who have confidence within their schools and community.
